

RECENT NEIGHBORHOOD EVENTS

The SASYNA General Membership Meeting was held Tuesday, May 6th at the Atwood Community Center. About 45 people shared homemade lasagna and discussed current neighborhood activities. There was a short summary of upcoming developments including the Ray O'Vac property on Winnebago. SASYNA will see preliminary redevelopment concepts for Ray O'Vac by July. Betty Chewning announced the upcoming pedestrian flag program at the intersection of Atwood Avenue and Ohio. There was over an hour discussion on reducing the impacts of the county airport on the neighborhood. Sharyn Wisniewski represented County Executive Kathy Falk and fielded questions with the help of three airport representatives including Bill White, neighborhood resident and chair for the airport's noise committee. Neighbors and SASYNA will need to continue pressure for improved noise control measures and contact Rep. Tammy Baldwin to reduce F-16 jet fighter flights over the neighborhood.

The same night, the Common Council approved a 15-unit apartment building at 2132 Atwood Avenue, former site of Gemini Landscapers, despite suggested improvements by SASYNA on behalf of adjacent neighbors. Construction begins this summer. Gemini has moved to 134 Fair Oaks Avenue, will have an open house on May 24th and has long term plans for a café and canoe rental along Starkweather Creek.
