Hi Becky,

Thank you for the information regarding the diagnostic review currently being performed on the HVAC system. It is reassuring to know that you will insist on replacement of the noise panel as part of the HVAC solution. Neighbors who have endured the noise generated by the HVAC chillers this summer will be pleased to hear the good news. To further put neighbors at ease regarding the HVAC noise, we ask that you provide the following assurances:

- The sound panel will be replaced before the start of the next cooling season.
- The HVAC contractor will identify additional strategies for reducing the noise.
- You will provide the neighborhood with a progress update on specifically when the sound panel will be re-installed and the additional noise abatement strategies identified by the HVAC contractor. April 15, is an easy date to remember for the update, but we are amenable to another date to accommodate your busy schedule if necessary.
- The Goodman Community Center (GCC) and the HVAC contractor will strive to limit HVAC-related noise to 55 dB or less during the day (after 7:00 a.m.) and 45 dB or less at night (after 7:00 p.m.).
 - The Goodman Center will take noise measurements during the next cooling season at several locations to monitor the effectiveness of the noise abatement strategies. The noise measurement locations will be agreed upon by the GCC and affected neighbors.

Becky, we understand the managerial and fiscal difficulties and strains associated with managing a large facility. We also support and in some cases utilize some of the wide array of services and programs that make up the Center. The Goodman Community Center is recognized as an asset to

the community and neighborhood.

As homeowners, we go to great lengths and invest a great deal of money to make our homes a safe and welcoming place for family and friends. It is, of course, the place we go to get away from it all after a long day of work. And, given where we live, within reason we accept periodic and temporary disturbances such as planes, loud cars and other noises associated with urban living. But, we also hope you understand the impact that the constant noise from the HVAC system has on our lives and on neighbors who visit Wirth Court Park with their children.

We look forward to hearing from you regarding our request for the timing for replacement of the sound panel and the date for providing us with an update on whether the Center can meet the proposed date for reinstalling the sound panel.
