Specific issue(s) to report: We cancelled our April 23 meeting in order to attend the first public planning redesign meeting of State Street Mall which took place at the same time. Transportation Committee members Larry, Lance and Donna attended the State Street Mall public planning meeting in order to carefully observe, take notes, and evaluate how that meeting was approached and conducted since it is identical to a meeting we will need to know how to replicate and produce in our neighborhood concerning the upcoming reconstructions of Atwood and Winnebago. We also wanted to see their timetable to see what a parallel timetable would look like in our neighborhood with our reconstruction dates overlaid onto it. It was extremely beneficial to attend. We were able to make contact with key city employees, perhaps forging smoother connectivity for the upcoming SASY Corridor Planning Committee meeting with the mayor which took place two days later. Also, the diagonal bike path crossing at Dunning and Atwood is currently being constructed.
